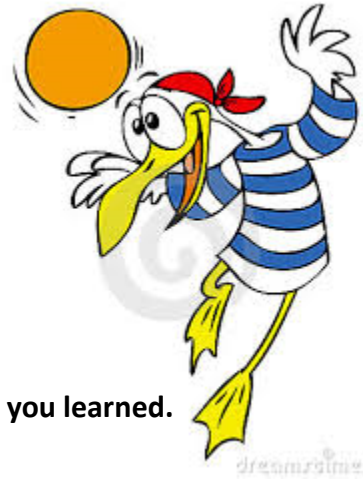

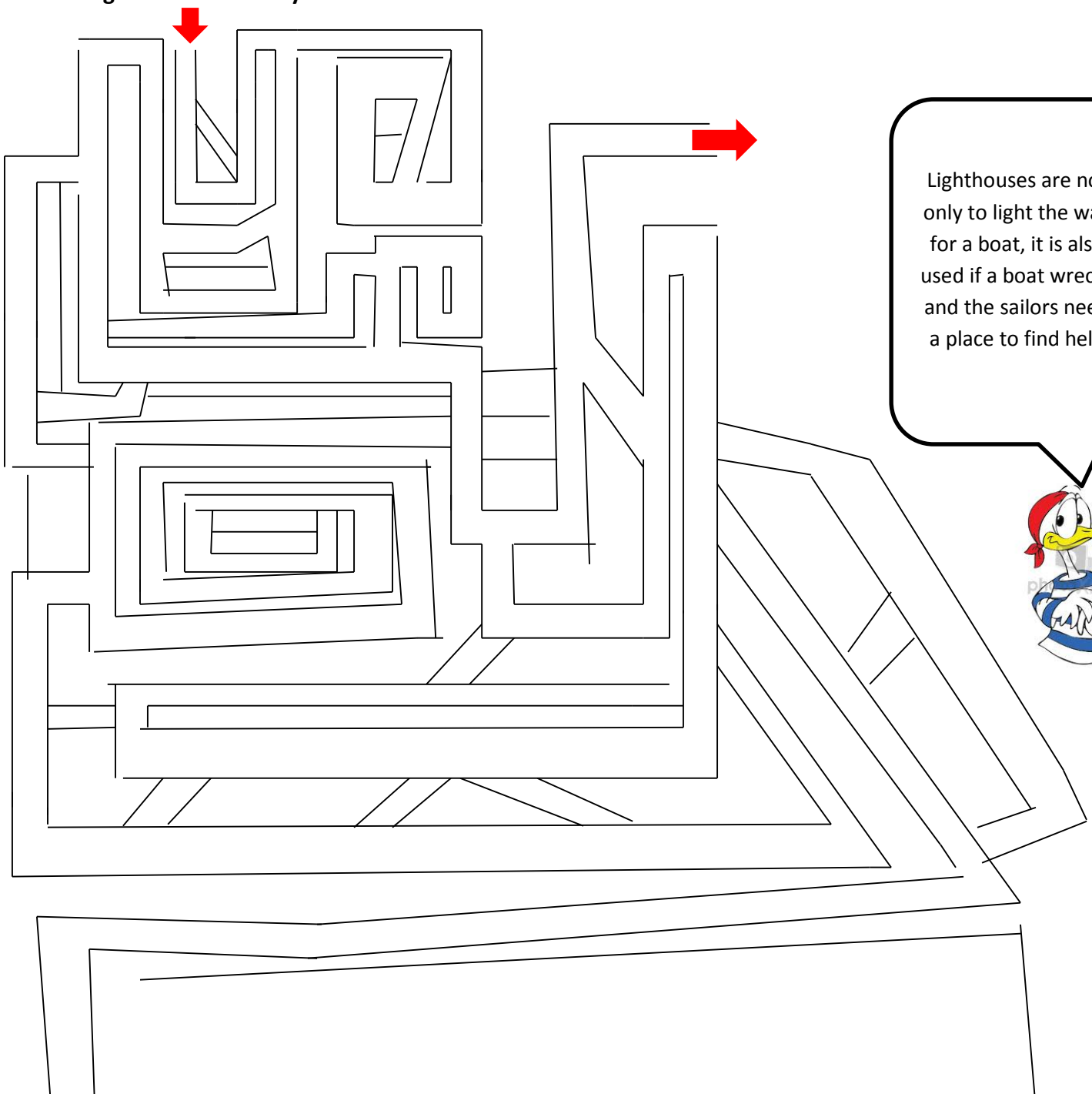

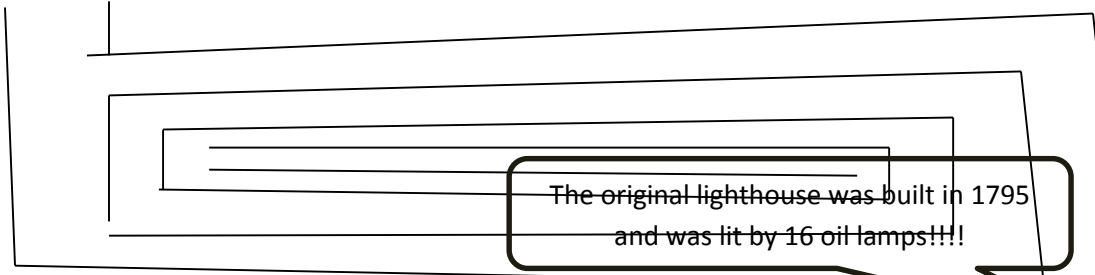
Activity#6: SHIPWRECK MAZE
